- Verb form that shows the "time of action", is called Tense.
- There are 3 main kinds of tense:
 - 1. Present tense
 - 2. Past tense
 - 3. Future tense
- To each tense there are 4 different forms:
- 1. Present tense
 - i. Simple present tense
 - ii. Present continuous tense
 - iii. Present perfect tense
 - iv. Present perfect continuous
- 2. Past tense
 - i. Simple past tense
 - ii. past continuous tense
 - iii. past perfect tense
 - iv. past perfect continuous
- 3. Future tense
 - i. Simple future tense
 - ii. future continuous tense
 - iii. future perfect tense
 - iv. future perfect continuous

Present tense:

Simple present tense:

a. To express a habitual action, general truths, and to indicate a future event that is part of a fixed programme or time table

Ex;

He drinks tea every morning

The sun rises in the east.

The match starts at 3 'o clock

Present continuous tense:

The present continuous form is

$$am + (v + ing)$$

is
$$+(v+ing)$$

$$are + (v + ing)$$

Ex:

He is singing

I am leaving for Chennai tonight

present perfect tense:

The present perfect form is

Has + past participle

Have + past participle

Ex;

She has just left

I have been to Chennai

Present perfect continuous tense:

Has been + (v+ ing)

Have been + (v + ing)

Ex;

I have been waiting for you since 2'o clock.

It has been raining since 5 'o clock

Past tense

Simple past tense:

Verbs like went, ate, wrote, spoke, did, etc., are in the simple past tense.

The simple past is used to indicate an action completed in the past. It often occurs with adverbs or adverb phrases of past time.

Ex;

I wrote a letter yesterday.

Past continuous tense:

Was + verb + ing

Were + verb + ing

Ex;

It was getting late.

Past perfect tense:

Had + past participle

Ex;

When I reached the station, the train had already left

Past perfect continuous:

Had been + verb + ing

Ex:

At that time he had been working there for five years

Future tense:

Simple future tense:

The simple future is used for an action that has still to take place.

Ex;

I shall meet you tomorrow.

Future continuous tense:

Will be + verb + ing

Ex;

When I get home, my dog will be sitting for me at the door.

Future perfect tense:

Will/ shall have + past participle

Ex;

I shall have completed the work by that time

Future perfect continuous tense:

Will have been + verb + ing

Ex;

By next august, we will have been studying in this college for two years.
