As per the recent announcement from the Dept of Pharmaceuticals, our country has enough stock and manufacturing capacity of the formulation to cater both the domestic requirement & export commitments.
- ✓ Indian Council of Medical Research had recommended hydroxychloroquine to be used as a preventive medication for persons in the high-risk group.

- ✓ Recently, Scientists from the Sree Chitra Tirunal Institute for Medical Sciences & Technology, Trivandrum has developed a diagnostic kit Chitra Gene LAMP-N, which uses RT-LAMP technique. It is less expensive and can give results in less than two hours.
