1. Which country's cabinet has approved their new political map that included Lipulekh, Kalapani and Limpiyadhura?

- ✓ The Cabinet of Nepal has recently approved their new political map including Lipulekh, Kalapani and Limpiyadhura under its territory.
- ✓ Nepal's Foreign Minister Pradeep Kumar Gyawali announced that the official map of Nepal will be released by the Ministry of Land Management soon. The announcement has been made amid a border dispute between India and Nepal. Both the countries claim Kalapani as an integral part of their territory.

✓ It was started from a Police station at Indore and is being implemented with the help of civilians, across the state. This scheme has been launched amid several accidents of the state involving migrants.

- The Union Housing and Urban Affairs Minister Hardeep Singh Puri announced the results of garbage–free star rating for the cities.
- The top '5 star garbage-free' tag was given to six cities including Chhattisgarh's Ambikapur, Madhya

Pradesh's Indore, Gujarat's Rajkot and Surat, Karnataka's Mysore and Maharashtra's Navi Mumbai.

 ✓ As many as 141 cities were rated based on their garbage management. 65 cities were given three-star while 70 were given one-star.

✓ Three Baltic countries in the northern Europe: Estonia, Latvia, and Lithuania initiated the re-connection measure named as 'travel bubble'. The European Union countries started this to make their economies back to form, after the post COVID-19 lockdowns.

They are also less populated and comparatively less affected by COVID–19. The travel bubble would allow members of the group to renew trade ties with each other and restart travel and tourism sector.

- ✓ The National Hydrographer to the government of India, Vice Admiral Vinay Badhwar, has been conferred with the 2019 Alexander Dalrymple Award. The award has been given for his significant contribution to Indian hydrography and across the Indian Ocean region.
- ✓ The award is presented to the personalities who contribute in raising the standards of hydrography, cartography and navigation around the world. It was first presented in 2006 by the UK Ministry of Defence– sponsored UKHO (UK Hydrographic Office).

6. As per the notification of the Jammu& Kashmir administration, what is the minimum duration of residence in the UT, to be eligible for domicile status?

- The Jammu & Kashmir government notified Jammu and Kashmir Grant of Domicile Certificate (Procedure) Rules, 2020. There shall be a timeline of 15 days for issuance of the certificate after which the applicant can approach an Appellate Authority.
- According to that, all people who have resided in the UT for 15 years, or have studied for 7 years and appeared in class 10th or 12th examination there and their children, Children of Government officials who have served in the UT for 10 years are eligible.
- ✓ Now, West Pakistan Refugees, sanitation workers and children of women married outside Jammu and Kashmir shall also be eligible for Domicile Certificate.

7. The Indian Railways' most powerful 12,000 hp electric locomotive has been manufactured by which company?

- ✓ The Indian Railways has recently operationalised its first 12,000 hp electric locomotive, between Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Station to Shivpur in Uttar Pradesh.
- ✓ It has been manufactured French rail transport firm Alstom, at the Madhepura Electric Locomotive Pvt. Ltd. (MELPL), in Bihar. MELPL is a joint venture between the French firm Alstom and the Indian Railways. With this, India became the sixth country in the world to produce indigenous high horsepower locomotive.

extraordinary board meeting decided the unanimous appointment of Dilip as the President for the next 2 yrs.

The funds are provided to support the agency's core programmes and services, especially education and health. India had also increased its annual contribution to the UNRWA from USD 1.25 million in 2016 to USD 5 million in 2019.

- ✓ The Executive Board of WHO comprises 34 executives related to the field of health, each representing a member country. The Chairman's post is held by rotation among the regional groups.

- ✓ The project outlay of Rs. 25 crore will be provided by the Centre. As per the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy, the scheme aims to set up 10 MW grid connected solar project and solar applications like solar trees and solar drinking water kiosks, to implement the scheme.

- ✓ The scheme was initially launched in 2017, to provide a guaranteed monthly payout to senior citizens. The maximum investment limit is Rs 15 lakh and the tenure of the policy is 10 years. Though the scheme assured 8% return last time, this year it would give 7.4% per annum. The interest rate will be modified every year, in line with the Senior Citizen Savings Scheme (SCSS).

9. The Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme (ECLGS), that was recently in news is associated with providing credit for which sector?

- The Union Cabinet has approved an additional funding of up to Rs 3 lakh crore through the Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme (ECLGS) for the MSME sector.
 - The Micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) that are hit hard by the coronavirus crisis will be granted an emergency credit at the rate of 9.25%. 100% guarantee coverage will be provided by National Credit Guarantee Trustee Company (NCGTC) for eligible MSMEs & MUDRA borrowers, in the form of a guaranteed emergency credit line facility.

- The number of Indo-Bangladesh Protocol routes are also being increased from 8 to 10. Among the newly added ports of call, Dhulian, Maia, Kolaghat, Sonamura and Jogigopha are in India while Rajshahi, Sultanganj, Chilmari, Dadkandi & Bahadurabad are in Bangladesh.

- ✓ She is a member of the IMF external advisory group working on policy challenges, including the COVID-19 pandemic and its economic impact. She has published a book titled "This Time is Different: Eight Centuries of Financial Folly" together with economist Kenneth Rogoff.

- ✓ As per their announcement, as many as 22 countries have requested and received access to the API so far. They also promised that the API would be destroyed once the pandemic is over and when contact-tracing apps are no longer required.

- ✓ As per the recent data of the Reserve Bank of India, the Bank credit increased 6.52 % year−on−year to Rs 102.52 trillion and Bank deposits grew 10.64 % to Rs 138.50 trillion in the fortnight ended May 8.
 - The data also highlighted that Private sector banks made the highest credit expansion and their share in total credit expanded to 35.7 %, 32 % and 30 % in 2019, 2018 and 2017 respectively. The data also revealed that bank credit growth (y–o–y) decelerated for the fourth successive quarter in December 2019.

- The Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT), the apex body under the Department of Revenue (Ministry of Finance) has recently notified changes in Safe Harbour Rules (SHR). As per the notification, the rates applicable from AY (Assessment Year) 2017–18 to 2019–20 will continue to apply for AY 2020–21.

The Ministry has divided the routes into seven bands based on duration of flights. 40% of the seats in any flight will have to be sold at the midpoint of the lower and upper air fare limits prescribed.

- It is expected that the US will pull out formally in six months, based on the withdrawal terms of the treaty. NATO allies and other countries have asked the US to remain in the treaty.

- ✓ As announced in the recent economic stimulus package, global procurements will be disallowed up to Rs 200 Crore, which will reduce unfair competition among the domestic suppliers and MSMEs. GFR is amended such that the limit of procurement may be prescribed by the Department of Expenditure from time to time.

3. As per the announcement of the Reserve Bank of India in May 2020, what is the updated repo rate?

✓ The Governor of Reserve Bank of India delivered his third such address since the nationwide lockdown. He announced a cut in the reportate by 40 basis points to 4% and the reverse repo is also simultaneously reduced by 40 bps to 3.35%.

Earlier in the month of April, the repo and reverse repo rates were fixed at 4.4% and 3.75% respectively. The Governor also extended moratorium on all term loans by another 3 months till August 31, 2020.
