- ODOP is a flagship initiative of Ministry of Commerce and Industry. Kashmir accounts for 90% of India's walnut production. They are known for the superior quality, taste and nutrients and hence widely in demand across the globe.



The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has kept India's growth forecast for 2021–22 unchanged at 9.5%, in its latest World Economic Outlook report. It also projected India's economy to grow 8.5% in FY23. It has lowered the global growth projection marginally to 5.9% from 6% earlier. Supply disruptions in advanced economies and worsening pandemic impact in developing countries are the reasons.
