The artificial aerosol layer can be created by deploying sulfur particles via cannons, balloons, or aircraft.

Harvesting was banned in 1992 due to concerns about forest diseases, but the ban was later limited to wildlife sanctuaries and government-owned protected forests, emphasizing potential ecological risks.
